Memorandum that the words of John Appleton Gent over the first line in the first sheet of paper of this will and the word nearly between the fifteenth and sixteenth line of the said sheet. and the words talked & paper Enowd between the twentieth and one and twentieth line of the said sheet. and the words. and torn away by between the first and second line of the second sheet of paper of this will and the words my Moste Mary between the fifth and sixth line of the said sheet. and the words woble Enowd's sum of money goods shall be and all other my between the ninth and tenth line of the said sheet were subscribed and interlined. and the paper in both of the said sheets were cut out before the sealing and publishing hereof and then sealed and published in the presence of John Stutch Katharine Whithead. In the name of God Amen I John Whittholles of Woolstaxington in the County of Huntingdon Yeoman, though sick and weak of body yet of perfect mind and memory praise be to god do make this my last will and Testament on the one and thirtieth of December Anno Domini 1645 in manner and forme following. I give unto the parish church of Woolstaxington one shilling. Item I give to the poore of Woolstaxington twenty shillings. Item I give unto my Grandchild Henry Snooke the lease and propriety of one house and eleven acres of ground with the appurtenances lying in Dunspill. Item I give unto my Daughter Mary Snooke the lease and lease of one tenement in Burnham for all the terms of time expressed. Item I give unto my Grandchild, a Francis Snooke fifty pounds to be paid her when she shall accomplish the age of one and twenty years, and if she die before she accomplish the age of one and twenty years then the said fifty pounds shall redound and remaine to the said Henry Snooke. Item I give unto George Conerton five pounds. Item I give unto my Grandchild Robert Conerton five pounds. Item I give unto Ann Cooper five pounds. Item I give unto Thomas Conerton five pounds. Item I give unto my Grandchild Mary Whittholles ten pounds to be paid to her when she shall accomplish the age of one and twenty years. And if she die before that time then the said ten pounds shall remaine to Francis Snooke. Item I give unto John Bully her daughter one little spanner yearling. Item I give unto Thomas Whittholles one cow heifer. Item I lend my plow unto John Bully for one journey he leading but xxx. hundred. Item I give unto Adrian Bully all my apparel which I now have. Item I make and ordaine Mary Snooke my Daughter Exorutrix of this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have unto set my hand and seals. of body but of good and perfect memory (prayed be god) Do make
this my last will and Testament in manner and form following. I hat it to
free His self I Comend my Soule into the hand of Almighty god that gave it unto
me hoping to be saved by the alone suffering and merits of my gracious
Jesus Christ. Item I comitt my body to Christian buriall to be buried in the
Church yarde of the parish wher I shall happen to dye, wher I would have my
Exequies here under mentioend to performe in an obsequious and privat manner and at
suddenly after my death as possibly the may observing therein no manner of pompe
or state but modestly and after a low degree for I have not desired so to have
taken of mortue be hind me. Here fore desire such abstynence my buriall may
have expressed so much in this my will to the intent that the same may be
sufficient to stop the mouthes of all such as shall aft after my death to exclaim
against myne Exequies for burying myne so narrow a manner. Item I comitt
my deare and loving wife Elize Glisson my whole and full Exequies of this
my last will and Testament. And I give to her not onely that moiety of the tyme
of Camperham which I now have in possession but also that other moiety of
the said tyme which is conveyed to me after the death of my father Doe
have and do hold the first moiety therof to her her Executors, Administrators
and Assignes from and immediatly after the time of my decease during all the
residue of the time and tennor ^{of years} that is to some and unknowne which were
granted by the Originall lease therof unto my said father under the
conditions in the said Originall lease comprised. In witness wherof I have
